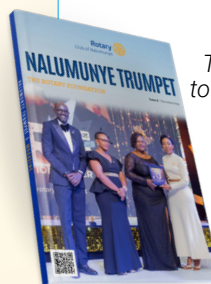

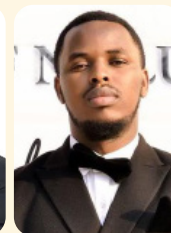

To Health and Happiness

December marks Rotary's Disease Prevention and Treatment Month, when we highlight our members' work to promote health and wellness, including mental wellness. Globally, nearly 1 in 7 people have a mental health disorder, according to a recent World Health Organization report. Yet only 9 percent of people with depression receive adequate treatment.

We are fortunate in Rotary to have a powerful way to support emotional well-being and happiness: friendship. The connections we build in Rotary can be a powerful force for change. I know this from personal experience.

When my fellow members first proposed that I become club president, I demurred. I had a stutter. I was terrified of speaking. But having club members who supported me and surrounded me with affection enabled me to face my fear, and I found a way to stand confidently before a crowd.

Today, I regularly address audiences — some numbering in the thousands — in a language that is not native to me. The Rotary members in my life helped me create lasting change within myself.

That fellowship gives us the courage and means to create lasting change in the world as well, and mental health services are in desperate need of improvement. The WHO reports that governments on average

devote only 2 percent of their health budgets to mental health, and only 11 percent of that funding reaches community-based services. In some countries, only one trained mental health professional is available for every 100,000 people. The WHO has called for strategic and urgent action to close the gap.

Rotary can answer that call by championing mental health awareness in our clubs, working with local health systems, funding training for community health workers, and supporting initiatives that bring care to places where none exists. Even small investments in mental health yield enormous returns in productivity, public health, and happiness.

While we are creating lasting change in the world, we cannot forget to take care of each other. Past RI President Gordon McInally wisely reminds us that we must go beyond asking, "How are you?" We owe it to each other to instead ask, "How are you really?"

As we transition to a new year filled with new possibilities, let us Unite for Good — for healing, friendship, and access to happiness.

3. Because Giving Is a Reflection of Our Rotary Values

Rotary is built on the ideals of Service Above Self and cheerful giving. When we give to the Foundation, we embody those ideals in their purest form. We don't give for titles, pins, or recognition — we give because we believe in humanity, in hope, and in the better future our giving helps create.

Giving to The Rotary Foundation is not just a financial act, it's a statement of faith in humanity and in Rotary's ability to make a difference.

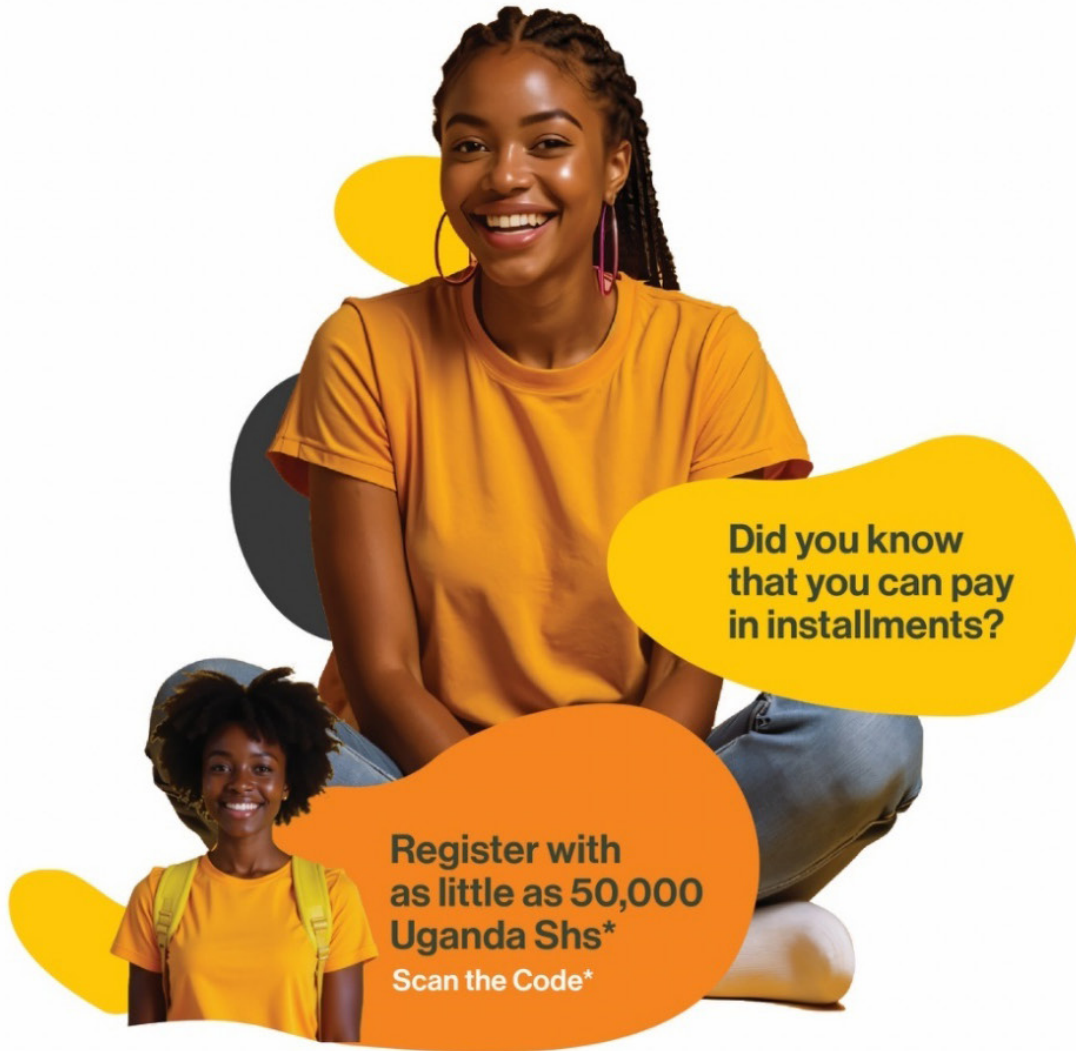

Community Service Updates

The Rotary Club of Nalumunye remains steadfast in its dedication to transforming communities through impactful service. This Action Year has been marked by tremendous progress across multiple projects, all inspired by Rotary's spirit of giving and collective effort.

Major Projects and Milestones

Kitebi Health Centre III Waiting Shade Nears Completion



Signature Project at Kitebi HC III. Transforming the Triage area under MCH Area of focus



One of our flagship projects this year—the construction of a patient waiting shade at Kitebi Health Centre III—is now 85% complete. This initiative will provide a safe and comfortable space for patients seeking medical services.

The groundbreaking ceremony was proudly officiated by District Governor Christine K. Kwaoooya on 27th August 2025.

Renovation of St. Josephant Catholic Church Toilet Facility



In response to community needs, RC Nalumunye successfully renovated the toilet facility at St. Josephant Catholic Church. The newly improved facility has since been handed over to church leaders and is already benefiting the wider community.

Water and Sanitation Support – Spring Well Renovation



Water access remains a key focus area. On 26th November 2025, the Rhinos Buddy Group conducted the groundbreaking for the renovation of a community spring well. Once completed, the well will meet high standards of safety and reliability, enhancing water access for local households.

Health Facility Improvements
