



5 REASONS TO JOIN ROTARY



More than Job Training

In a garage outside Salinas, California, young people who are learning to restore classic cars are doing more than developing a skill- they are reclaiming their futures. This training program provides mentorship and, for some, a path away from gang involvement toward meaningful employment. Graduates leave with certifications, practical experience, and hope.

This is what Rotary's Vocational Service Month celebrates each January- the power of bringing together people with unique skills to do good in the world. It reminds us that integrity isn't just about our actions matching our words. Integrity is in everything we do.

The California automotive program has been such a success because it was built on integrity. Members of the Rotary Club of Carmel-by-the-Sea didn't assume they knew what the community needed. They listened. They learned there was a shortage of skilled mechanics as well as a large number of young people lacking job training. They recognized that technical skills alone wouldn't be enough, so they partnered with Rancho Cielo, a nonprofit offering counseling and support services alongside vocational training.

That is The Four-Way Test in action. Those four simple questions help us not judge others but guide us toward genuine, effective service.

Let integrity guide you. Let The Four-Way Test light your path. And let the young people in California and the multitudes worldwide who need job skills remind you why vocational service matters.


Let us celebrate putting our professional skills to work for humanity with integrity at the heart of everything we do.

Built with heart, delivered with purpose: Our Maternal & Child Health Signature Project is to improve comfort & dignity at the first point of care

Change often begins with a simple but powerful act of LISTENING. At Kitebi Health Centre III, that act has led to a meaningful transformation that is restoring dignity, compassion, and hope for mothers, newborns, and children.

For years, expectant mothers were received in a small, overcrowded Triage Tent. When the numbers rose, patients were exposed to sun and rain at one of their most vulnerable moments. Recognizing this challenge, the Rotary Club of Nalumunye, guided by Rotary District 9214's focus on Maternal and Child Health, resolved to act.

That resolve culminated in the successful completion and commissioning of a fully

constructed and furnished Maternal & Child Health Triage Facility. The project was officially commissioned by District Governor Christine Kyeyune Kawooya accompanied by the agile Country Chair, PAG Apollo Ampumwize on 17th December 2025, marking a significant milestone in improving first-point care at the facility.

While presenting the project, Action President Deborah K. Kakande noted that the Triage Facility was fully funded by Rotarians of RC Nalumunye. "Dear Governor, these Rotarians you see here, and others who have not been able to make it to this event have pulled resources and funded the construction of this Facility. I want to appreciate them so much for the immense support." President Deborah said.

Kitebi Health Centre III serves between 700-1,000 antenatal mothers and supports about 350 deliveries monthly. According to the In-Charge, Dr. Irene Kawooya Nakanyike, the new facility has replaced congestion and exposure with a safe, private, and welcoming space. "This is truly an answered prayer," she shared, thanking the club for delivering a priority need in less than four months.

Beyond construction, the Facility was equipped with essential furniture by the Buffaloes Buddy Group, and privacy screens by the Tigers Buddy Group, making it fully functional. It now stands as the Rotary Club of Nalumunye's Maternal and Child Health Signature Project for the Action Year.



The most powerful testimony came from the mothers themselves—smiles, relief, and gratitude for a space that recognizes their comfort and worth. The impact is visible: dignity restored at the very first point of care.

This is Service Above Self in action—transforming lives, one thoughtful intervention at a time.

Governor Christine while commissioning the Triage Facility expressed delight at the swift completion of the Facility, describing it as “the best Christmas gift for the mothers.” She added, “Thank you President Debbie for the leadership, thank you members of RC Nalumunye, thank you KCCA for giving us the opportunity, and thank you to everyone who is taking a step to improve the lives in our society.”


Lions Buddy Group undertook the renovation of Rtn Alice Zalwango's clinic, contributing to improved healthcare delivery and its work still in progress.

continue to provide a strong foundation upon which our club thrives.





Rotaract Club of Nalumunye – Championing Basic Literacy and Education

Introduction

Education remains one of the most powerful tools for breaking cycles of poverty and shaping resilient, self-reliant communities. At the Rotaract Club of Nalumunye, we firmly believe that when a child is given access to quality education, hope is restored- not only for the learner, but for families, communities, and generations to come. Guided by this conviction and aligned with Rotary International's Focus Area of Basic Education and Literacy, our club continues to invest in practical, community-centered initiatives that create sustainable and measurable impact.

Supporting Learning Through Scholastic Empowerment

On 2nd December 2025, the Rotaract Club of Nalumunye proudly participated in the Speech Day celebrations at Bishop Bukenya Church of Uganda Primary School in Zzira. The event highlighted the confidence, creativity, and character that education instills in young learners. During this visit, the club donated essential scholastic materials to pupils, reaffirming our commitment to ensuring that no child's education is disrupted due to a lack of basic learning tools.

Amaanyi g'Ekitabo ne Kkalamu Initiative



This intervention was conducted under our flagship education initiative, "Amaanyi g'Ekitabo ne Kkalamu," a project founded on the belief that knowledge and health are inseparable pillars of a child's success. Through this initiative, the Rotaract Club of

Nalumunye supports vulnerable pupils by contributing toward school fees, learning materials, and general scholastic welfare. This support enables children from underprivileged backgrounds to remain in school, improve academic performance, and develop confidence in their abilities.

Namengo Uplift Project – A Partnership for Sustainable Impact

The Namengo Uplift Project is a transformative partnership initiative jointly implemented by the Rotaract Club of Nalumunye, the Rotary Club of Nalumunye, and the Rotary Club of Nalumunye Heights. The project is being implemented at St. Anthony Namengo Boys Primary School in Budaka District and has been designed as a three-year intervention aimed to address sanitation, health, and learner welfare challenges in a sustainable manner. Significant progress has already been made. The construction of the school sick bay has reached an advanced stage and is currently at an upper level of finishing. Once completed, the facility will provide timely medical care, reduce health-related absenteeism, and improve overall learner wellbeing. However, additional resources are still required to fully equip and operationalize the sick bay.



Construction of modern toilet facilities is currently underway, with works at the foundation stage. These sanitation facilities are critical to improving hygiene, dignity, and attendance among pupils. To advance this component to completion, the project actively seeks additional financial and material support from partners and well-wishers. Beyond infrastructure, the project has embraced a holistic development approach. Tree planting activities were conducted to enhance environmental sustainability and create a healthier school environment. In addition, donations of clothes, shoes, and school bags were provided to vulnerable pupils, directly supporting school attendance, confidence, and retention.

Projected Results and Impact

Upon full completion of the Namengo Uplift Project, the school will experience measurable and long-term impact. Improved sanitation facilities will lead to better hygiene practices, reduced illness, and increased learner attendance, particularly among younger pupils. A fully functional and equipped sick bay will ensure early medical intervention, reduced absenteeism, and a safer learning environment for both pupils and staff.



Environmental conservation efforts through tree planting will contribute to improved air quality, shade, and climate resilience within the school. Combined with improved learner welfare through material support, the project is expected to enhance learner concentration, academic performance, and overall school retention rates. As a phased three-year initiative, continued support will ensure sustainability, ownership, and lasting transformation for the Namengo school community.

Streamlined Pupil Sponsorship Program

As part of our long-term commitment to educational continuity, the clubs have established a streamlined sponsorship arrangement for a select number of profiled pupils, with special emphasis on those in candidate classes. Learners in candidate classes face increased academic, financial, and psychological pressure due to national examinations, registration costs, and the need for uninterrupted attendance. Targeted sponsorship at this critical stage minimizes

dropout rates, protects prior investments made in the learners' education, and significantly improves performance outcomes. By supporting candidate class pupils, the project ensures smoother transition to the next level of education and maximizes the long-term impact of educational support.

Conclusion and Call to Action

Through these initiatives, the Rotaract Club of Nalumunye and its Rotary partners continue to demonstrate that basic literacy and education are achievable outcomes when young leaders collaborate with purpose, compassion, and accountability. While meaningful progress has been achieved, continued support is essential to fully realize the objectives of the Namengo Uplift Project. We therefore invite partners, donors, and stakeholders to join us in completing this three-year journey of transformation. Together, we can empower minds, improve learning environments, and build futures grounded in dignity, health, and opportunity.


