

At last month's International Assembly, President-elect Olayinka "Yinka" Hakeem Babalola called on members of the Rotary world to live out our presidential message for the 2026-27 Rotary year: Create Lasting Impact.

This February, as we observe Peacebuilding and Conflict Prevention Month, we have an opportunity to channel Yinka's call to action into real change.

Peace is not simply the absence of war. A life free from conflict but marked by hunger, instability, or the inability to care for one's family is not true peace. Peace requires liberty, opportunity, and respect for human dignity. Yet fear often blocks that path — fear of change, of cultural loss, of people we don't understand.

Fear isn't defeated through avoidance or aggression. Knowledge is the first step toward peace. Rotary embraces this idea. Our Rotary Peace Centers and their peace fellows, along with other peace education initiatives, demonstrate how knowledge builds trust and helps communities find solutions to conflict.

In Colombia, decades of conflict have left deep wounds. The 2025 Rotary Foundation Programs of Scale awardee, Pathways to Peace and Prosperity, partners with the United Nations World Food Programme to expand opportunity, improve conflict resolution, and

connect people with social services. Its goal is to break cycles of violence, poverty, and food insecurity so peace can take root.

In Maharashtra, India, People of Action honoree Swati Herkal

built peace through prosperity. Her project confronted farmers' declining soil health, rising debt, and illness caused by chemical fertilizers. She and her Rotary partners launched a regenerative agriculture program that revitalized the land, lowered costs, and restored stability. More than 1,100 farmers now participate and over 50 villages have adopted the model.

Rotary also advances peace by restoring dignity. In Chad, Rotary Peace Fellow Domino Frank discovered that more than 1,500 women who fought in a rebellion had been erased from reintegration programs. His advocacy led to Chad's first Rotary Foundation global grant and the creation of Corridors of Peace. More than 100 women — triple the goal — completed literacy and vocational training and formed a cooperative to support their families.

From Colombia to India to Chad, the lesson is clear: Peace is not a dream. It is the result of sustained action with a focus on true, lasting impact. To replicate these successes, Rotary clubs can take three steps: Learn from peace fellows and other peace experts in our organization, apply a peacebuilding lens to community assessments, and prioritize impact over ceremony.

In a world filled with fear, Rotary cannot be satisfied with half-measures and empty words. If we are truly people of action, then action must define us. Together, we can Create Lasting Impact — across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves.

But every step you take, you'll find your keep



A vocation is traditionally defined as a person's occupation or calling, especially one to which they are strongly drawn and for which they are well suited. It's not simply a job for earning income, but a meaningful pursuit through which individuals contribute their skills, knowledge and energy to society.

Vocational service, as embraced by Rotary International, builds on this idea by encouraging individuals to use their professions as platforms for service. It emphasizes integrity, ethical behavior, and excellence in work while demonstrating how professional skills can be directed towards the betterment of communities. In Rotary, a vocation is not just what you do, it's a way to make lasting impact. Recognized as the second avenue of service in Rotary, vocational service focuses on promoting ethical standards in professional life and encouraging members to see their daily work as a form of service. Rotarians are called to

lead by example, demonstrating honesty, fairness and responsibility in their occupations while contributing positively to society.

Vocations hold particular importance to Rotarians because each member brings unique expertise that strengthens both the organization and wider community. Through vocational service, members mentor young people, provide guidance in career development, and show that professionalism combined with ethics can create meaningful, lasting change.

Vocational service was one of the four original Rotary avenues of service established at the organisation's founding. To highlight the importance of ethical professional conduct, Rotary's

founders believed that strong communities are built not through charity but also through integrity, leadership and excellence in every profession. This core principle continues to guide Rotarians today.

The focus of vocational service is clear, upholding high ethical standards in all occupations, respecting the value of every profession, and applying professional skills to address societal needs. It also encourages vocational training, mentorship, and the cultivation of careers that empower individuals while contributing to community development.



Project at Kitebi Health Center IV: An Aura of Warmth and Sustainable Impact

The Rotary Club of Nalumunye dedicated this year to implementing some of the most impactful, community-oriented and people-centered projects, whose outcomes aren't just visible but compelling.

From building a triage facility at Kitebi Health Centre III for waiting patients, to planting anti-malaria trees and enhancing access to clean water and sanitation. All these initiatives reflect the club's relentless commitment to making the world a better place to live, during this action year under the leadership of Action President, Deborah Komugisha Kakande.

I recently took off some time over the weekend to visit and appreciate the club's community projects under Maternal and Child Health (MCH) and Disease Prevention at

Kitebi Health Centre III in Rubaga division, Kampala. It was gratifying to see that the projects have been successfully completed

The triage which welcomes visitors at the health centre now stands tall marked with the Nalumunye foundation stone laid by District 9214 Governor, Christine Kyeyune Kawooya on 27th August 2025. RC Nalumunye also planted over 40 trees including anti-malaria plants around the health centre to keep mosquitoes at bay and also green up the environment- a key area of focus in Rotary. The plants are growing well and spreading warmth and natural aura to the staff and visitors of the health centre, making the environment livelier. Prior to the construction of the triage facility, patients had no shelter and faced shelter challenges at the health centre,

often exposed to all weather conditions.

As one of the Rotary International focus areas, access to maternal and child health has continued to attract attention throughout the world and Uganda like many countries continues to face challenges with both maternal and newborn mortality. For example, Uganda's current maternal mortality ratio (MMR) stands at 189 deaths per 100,000 live births which significantly remains high above the global Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) target of 70 per 100,000 live births and the national target of 140 deaths per 100,000 live births by 2030. Such glaring facts are what compels Rotarians to stand in the gap by preventing loss of lives due to dysfunctional health infrastructure, inadequate drugs and supplies among others.






Service Delivery


