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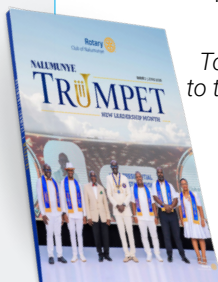

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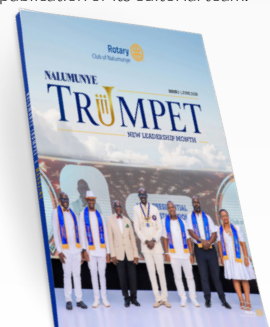

Let's Carry the Momentum

At the close of every Rotary year, we are invited to look back not only at what was done, but at what was discovered along the way. For RI President Francesco Arezzo, this year has been a journey across continents, clubs, communities, and cultures. Yet beneath the travel, the meetings, and the formal moments, one truth has continued to shine: Rotary is strongest when people choose to act together.

Across the world, the Rotary family has demonstrated kindness, resilience, and deep commitment to service. From historic cities to emerging communities, from long-established clubs to innovative new models of Rotary fellowship, the same spirit has appeared again and again. Rotarians and partners have worked side by side, not for recognition, but because they believe positive change is possible when people share a common purpose and remain faithful to it long after the applause fades.

That is the heart of this year's message. Rotary is not something we merely attend. It is something we do. It lives in the hands that build, the minds that solve, the hearts that care, and the communities that are changed because ordinary



people decide to become people of action. When Rotary moves from meeting rooms into the world, it transforms not only the lives of those served, but also the lives of those who serve.

This year has also reminded us that peace remains one of Rotary's deepest callings. In a world often marked by division and uncertainty, Rotary continues to build conditions where understanding can grow. Peace is not sustained by words alone. It requires intentional effort, patient leadership, listening, partnership, and the courage to keep choosing goodwill even when the world feels difficult.

The same determination is needed in the fight to end polio. The final mile is rarely easy, but Rotary has never been a movement that stops simply because the work becomes hard. The promise made to the children of the world still calls us forward with urgency and faith. As the year ends, the message is not simply one of farewell. It is a charge to continue.

The momentum built through service, partnership, giving, and leadership must not fade with the change of calendar. It must be carried into the next year with confidence.

When Rotary unites for good, communities rise. When members act with compassion, hope expands. And when we keep moving together, there is no challenge too great for the Rotary family to face.

Better Than Your Best

Rotary has a way of surprising you. It surprises you when a stranger across the table becomes a lifelong friend. It surprises you when a small project in one neighborhood ripples outward in ways you never imagined. And it may surprise you when you realize that the person Rotary has changed most ... is you.

That is why this year, we are called to harness the change within ourselves, to look to the future, and to Create Lasting Impact.

Now, I want to be clear about what those words mean. Change is only the beginning. Impact is what endures. We must think of the long-term impact of every project. How can a new water system contribute to the long-term health of a community? Can residents help other communities build their own? How can a new classroom be part of a wider strategy to improve education in the area? That is the sort of thinking we need.

As we prioritize impact, we must also consider how our actions can contribute to peacebuilding. Peace does not happen by accident. It must be built deliberately and strategically. As you plan your next project, ask yourself: "How does this create the conditions for

peace?" Consult the Pillars of Positive Peace to learn how we can bring the world one step closer to peace in everything we do.

The more you change your community and the world, the

more you will change. Don't just tell people about the projects you have run or the funds you have raised. Tell them how Rotary has shaped who you are. Those personal stories open doors, inspire new members, and remind all of us why we are here.

Storytelling is also an excellent way to recruit new members and raise funds. We need more people standing with us and more resources if we are to end polio, spread peace, and have a lasting impact on the world. We have set a goal of increasing membership to 1.25 million Rotarians and more than 125,000 Rotaractors by 2030, just in time for Rotary's 125th anniversary.

Sit down with your club and look back over your accomplishments in the last few years. Find your best year. Maybe it was a record year for new members. Maybe you reached a fundraising milestone. Maybe you completed a project that the whole community is still talking about. Once you find that year, I challenge you to do better than your best.

In these ways and more, we will Create Lasting Impact across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves.

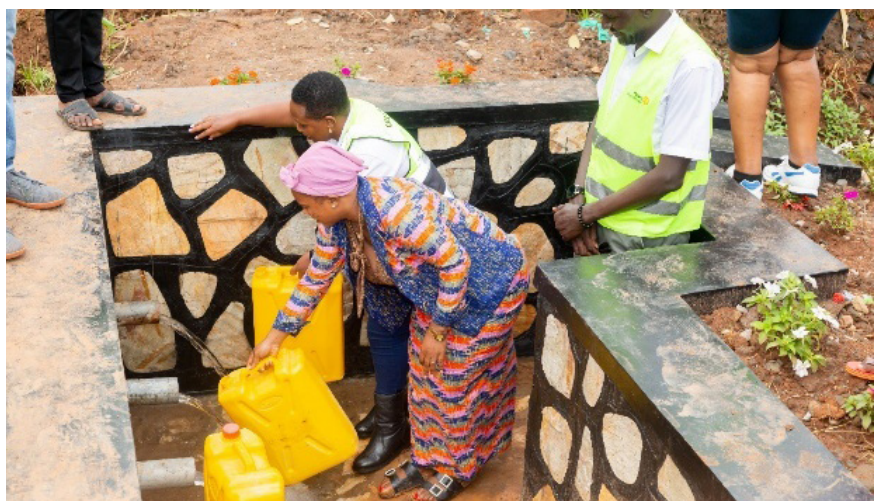

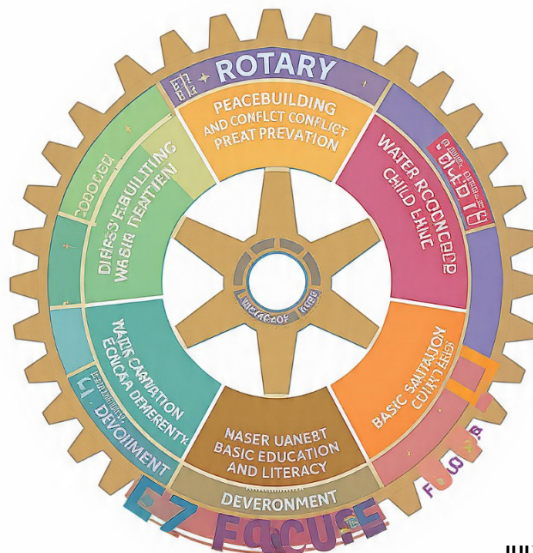

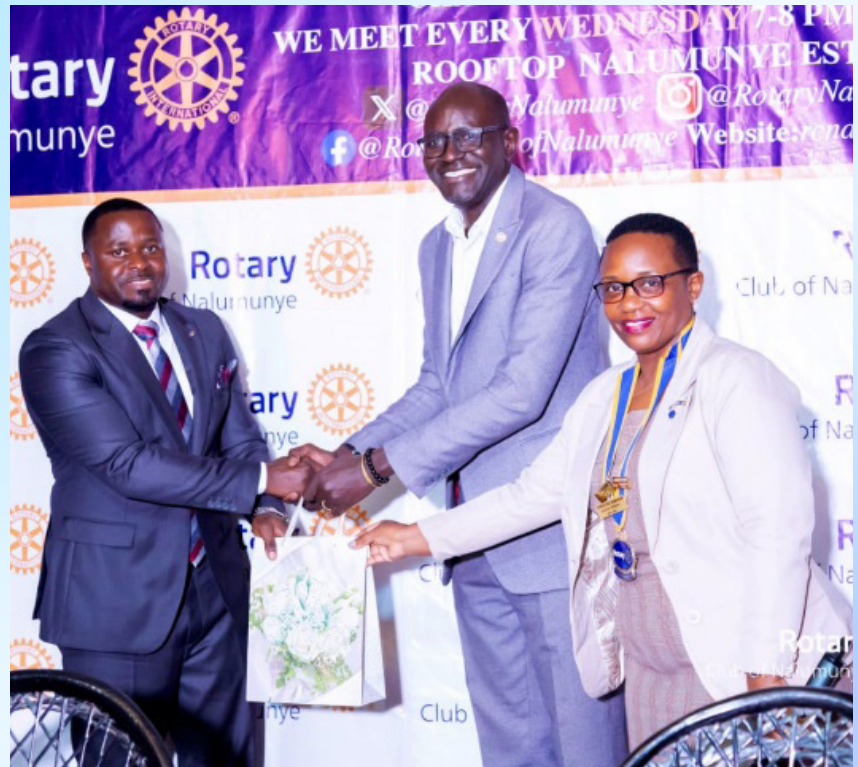
"God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work." (2 Corinthians 9:8)

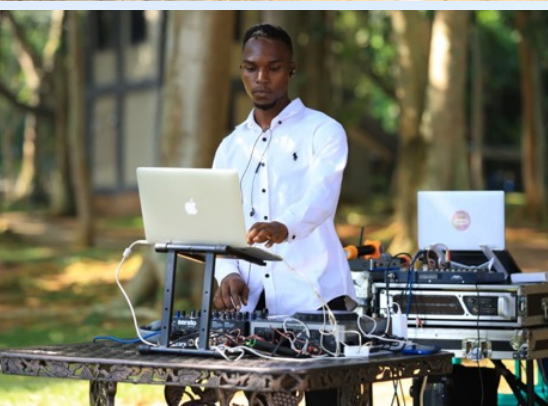

Rotarians Gather for Lasting Impact!

The Strategic Importance of the One-Hour Rotary Meeting

Within the governance framework of Rotary International, the one-hour meeting principle is more than a tradition—it is a strategic discipline that safeguards effectiveness and long-term sustainability. In today's demanding professional environment, respect for time reflects leadership maturity and institutional discipline.

Rotarians are busy people—executives, entrepreneurs, and community leaders with naturally limited attention spans after long workdays. When meetings exceed their scheduled duration, engagement declines and productivity diminishes. A structured one-hour meeting protects energy, sharpens focus, and reinforces Rotary's professional identity.

Every meeting should have a clearly structured agenda. To preserve discipline, time may be allocated as follows:

1. **Welcome Remarks (President)** – 3 minutes
2. **Club Norms** – 5 minutes

3. **Introduction of Rotarians and Rotaractors** – 5 minutes
4. **Recognition of Guests** – 5 minutes *(This may also be done at the end if the programme is tight. Where there are many visiting Rotarians, individual introductions should be skipped and recognition done collectively during the roll call of clubs.)*
5. **Introduction of the Guest Speaker** – 3 minutes *(A brief profile should be shared in advance or projected.)*
6. **Guest Speaker's Presentation** – 20 minutes
7. **Question and Answer Session** – 5 minutes
8. **SAA Session and Announcements** – 5 minutes *(Announcements should be handled at the end to avoid disrupting the flow.)*

They may also be projected to save time. Clubs should maintain separate books for member/guest registration, Polio contributions, Happy Shilling/Dollar, and announcements.)

9. **Closing Remarks** – 5 minutes

This structure promotes clarity, minimises repetition, and ensures balanced participation. Time discipline strengthens attendance, enhances member retention, and preserves Rotary's culture of excellence.



The one-hour meeting is not restrictive; it is strategic. By honouring it, clubs safeguard professionalism, member engagement, and institutional credibility.

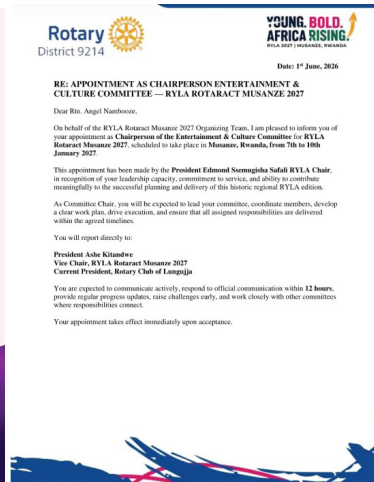
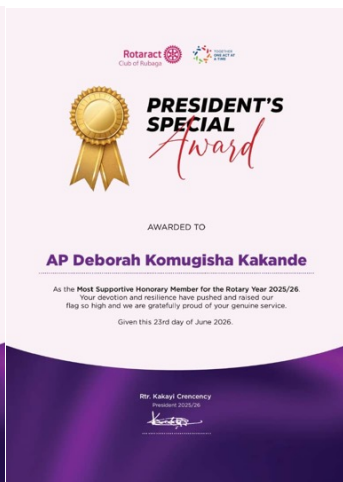
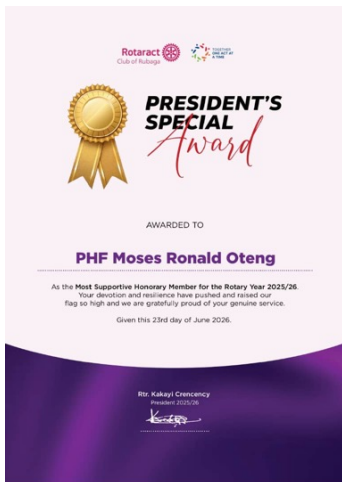
